Guidelines for Eligibility for the UCC Professional Scholarship

1. Applicant is a citizen or permanent resident of Australia, New Zealand or PNG
2. If requested, applicants must provide a copy of their birth certificates or proof of residency/citizenship.
3. An application form must be completed and submitted to the ACA Foundation Limited by the deadline, including the following details;
 - Name & Contact Details
 - Company/Institution Details
 - Academic, conference/courses and work histories
 - 250 word outline in support of the application
 - Letter of support from company/institution
 - 2 referees
4. Applications for an ACA Foundation Limited Scholarship are made directly to the ACA Foundation.
5. Scholarships are only awarded in response to applications. If no applications have been received, that the judging panel believe warrant a Scholarship, then no Scholarship will be awarded.
6. The applicant must demonstrate that their employer or educational institution will support their application and participation in the Scholarship.
7. The ACA Foundation Limited Scholarship judging panel will be determined by the ACA Foundation Limited Board
8. The judges reserve the right to request a brief presentation via teleconference with short listed applicants.
9. The ACA Foundation Limited Judging Panel's decision is final.
10. The Scholarship's shall be judged upon the following criteria:
 - Ability to present a clear and concise case
 - Referee's comments
 - ACA Foundation's focus on access, equity and participation
11. Each Scholarship recipient will be contacted by the ACA Foundation and their names/images will appear in ACA and ACA Foundation Limited collateral.
